Hourly Educators are given contracts for the entire year, but during winter and summer, hours will be limited. During peak seasons, hours will be based on your availability and the camp schedule. Peak seasons are as follows:

Spring April 2 – June 18

Fall August 20- November 18

Compensation: From \$9.50 per hour, based on experience and qualifications. Hours per week vary depending on camp schedule.

Minimum experience & qualifications: Must enjoy working with children and have experience in outdoor education or related field. American Red Cross First Aid/CPR certification (on-site training available. High school diploma or equivalent required.

Additional qualifications & attributes: Outdoor Educators with the ability to multi-task, who are hard-working, flexible, self-starters are preferred. Educators should have the drive to continuously train and educate both self and others. An Outdoor Educator who demonstrates knowledge of the experiential learning cycle and can translate concepts into programming is desired. American Red Cross Lifeguard certification (on-site training available). Supplementary but not required: American Canoe Association Instructor certification, ACCT Practitioner certification

Areas of responsibility: An Outdoor Educator will be primarily responsible for the delivery of program for our Adventure & Retreat Center clientele. Hours/days worked per week vary according to camp schedule/needs, and can be worked around school schedules or other jobs as necessary. The major areas of responsibility include, but are not limited to:

- Facilitating all Adventure & Retreat Center programs in accordance with current standards, addressing grade level content expectations
- Serving as an overall guide to groups while maintaining a strong customer service attitude
- Modeling care of all program materials and facilities; communicating needs to Program Coordinator and/or Program Director as necessary
- Participation in staff training and development
- Completion of assigned projects including maintenance, setup and cleanup of both general camp facilities and program-specific areas
- Training staff in program areas as needed
- Maintaining excellent communication with management and all levels of staff
- Timeliness and preparedness at all times in order to ensure best possible program delivery
